Spatzenschule is committed to child safety. We have zero tolerance of child abuse, and all allegations and concerns for the safety and wellbeing of a child will be treated seriously and consistently according to our policies and procedures. We recognise that we have legal and moral obligations to contact authorities when we are concerned about a child's safety, which we follow rigorously.

Spatzenschule want children to be safe, happy and empowered. We support and respect all children and are committed to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children, the cultural safety of children from a culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and to providing a safe environment for children with a disability, children in out of home care and LGBTIQ+ children and young people.

Spatzenschule are committed to the safety, participation and empowerment of all children and employ a range of strategies to include their voices in the development of our programs and activities.

Spatzenschule is committed to preventing child abuse through the proactive identification of risks and the removal and reduction of these risks wherever possible. We have robust human resources and recruitment practices for all staff and volunteers and are committed to providing regular training and education for staff and volunteers.

Spatzenschule nominates a child safety officer who must be up to date with child safety requirements and able to promote and effectively communicate with a range of stakeholders.

Spatzenschule have specific policies, procedures and training in place that support our leadership team, staff and volunteers to achieve these commitments.
